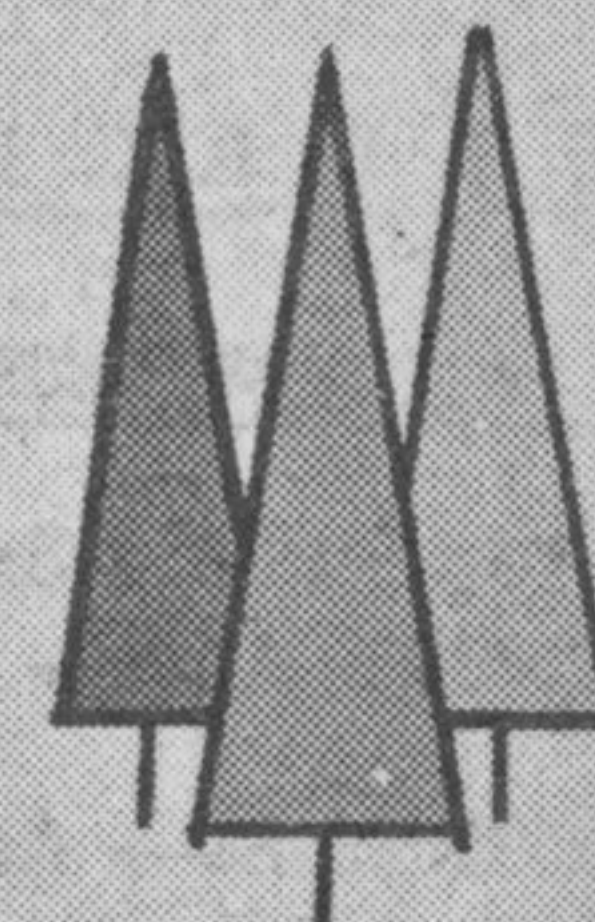

## TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

Mr. Wayne Young, of the Boy Scout Group Committee of Terrace Bay, met with Town Council on Tuesday evening, to discuss the need for funds to rejuvenate the Scout Camp building at White Sand Lake. Because the Boy Scout Association do not solicit funds, Wayne is a member of a special committee set up to try and solve the problem of finding the needed money to repair the camp and improve the road in to it.

He explained that there are approximately 157 young people in Terrace Bay and 105 in Schreiber, who would make use of the facilities, if they could be brought up to standard. Letters have been sent out to various organizations in the area, requesting support for this worthwhile venture. Wayne assured Council that there were many men who had offered their services if the needed money could be raised. Council agreed to discuss the matter at their final budget meeting.

Minutes were adopted as read and correspondence read. District 3, A.M.E.U., gave notice of the annual meeting to be held in Toronto in August.

Don Stewart, who had attended the O.M.E.U./A.M.E.U. convention in Toronto submitted a comprehensive report, and was commended by Council for an excellent report.

A letter from Jack Stokes, M.P.P. stated he supported the recent resolution of Marathon Council, regarding the Home for Senior Citizens, Birchwood Terrace, suggesting the government pay the capital costs, rather than the municipalities involved.

The Ontario Municipal Board will hold a hearing on May 3rd, in respect to assets and
