

MCCAUSLAND HOSPITAL BULLETIN

With the second annual meeting of The McCausland Hospital Corporation less than two weeks away, it is perhaps a suitable time to share ones feelings and thoughts about trusteeship or being a member of the Board of Governors.

Our local Hospital Board consists of eight elected members, one hospital representative appointed by each of the Municipalities of Schreiber and Terrace Bay, the President of the Auxiliary to The McCausland Hospital and the Chief of the Medical Staff - giving a total of twelve members.

Members are elected for two year terms, with at least four candidates standing for election each year. This year is no exception and it is expected at least four governors must be elected.
