The following motion will be presented to

ation at the Annual Meeting on April 24, 1973:

#### BY-LAW NO. 2

BE IT ENACTED as a by-law of The McCausland  
Hospital as follows:

Section 73 of the Hospital By-Laws of The  
McCausland Hospital be and the same are here-  
by amended by deleting Section 73 and sub-  
stituting the following therefor:

#### 73. Credentials Committee

(1) The Credentials Committee shall consist  
of a general practitioner from the Active  
Staff and two physicians appointed to the  
Honourary Staff by the Board with the primary  
purpose of serving on the Credentials Com-  
mittee.

(2) The Committee shall elect its own  
chairman.
