Certainly, the young adolescent years are critical in the development of future citizens and this is the reason for the strong focus on the Intermediate Curriculum Review ordered by the Minister. Submissions began even before the official opening date of January, I973.

One important factor is that the town has land available on Alberta Street, deeded to the Township by the C.P.R. many years ago for medical purposes.

This project would be a direct benefit to the town, serving all ages, and, in effect, a minor industry, with revenue accruing from rentals, and would in no way conflict with Schreiber's support of the McCausland General Hospital, as it is simply a consolidation of services required within this town.

Comments from the group attending indicated their feeling that a doctor would be attracted to a town with a medical centre and that to continued page 6
