Lunch was served by Mrs. G. Soughton and Mrs. E. Cornfield.

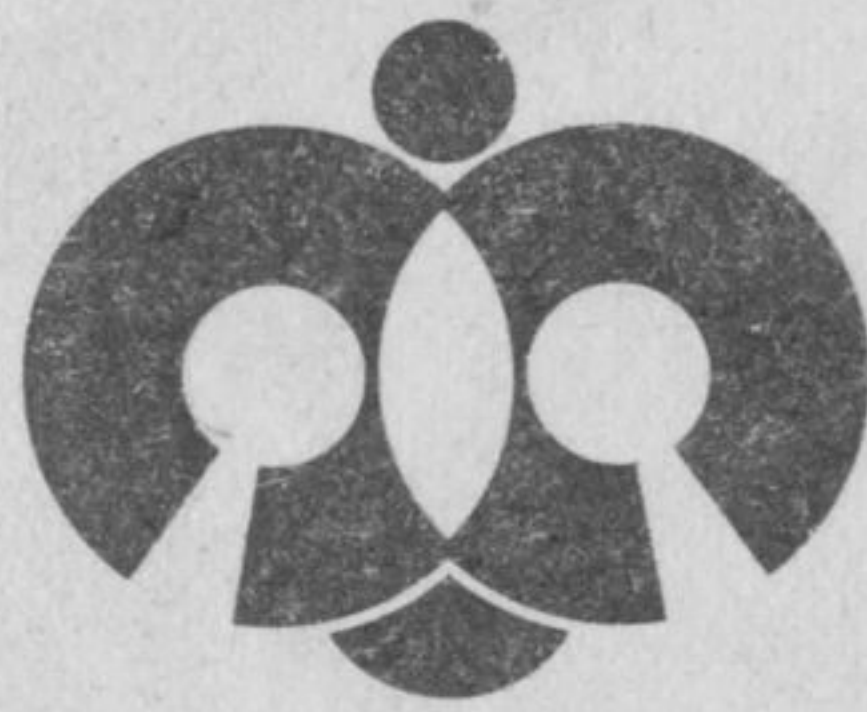
CANADIAN POLICE WEEK MAY 13 TO 19
