his schoolwork is suffering as a result of the home situation."

In order to better assist Thunder Bay's youth, ACCESS staff hopes to attract community-wide involvement. "We see our program as being a catalyst," says Mr. Llewellyn, "and not as THE sole agency to tackle all adolescent problems." Their research has indicated that Thunder Bay requires a co-ordinated service designed specifically for its adolescent group-one which will include persons from all walks of life. "We'd like to see parent groups, agency personnel and interested individuals become directly involved with the program," he said. "We believe that Thunder Bay residents must begin to realize that general problems in the community are sometimes reflected in its adolescents."

The first step towards this type of involvement will be taken within the next few weeks as volunteers begin working with a group of younger ACCESS participants in a recreational therapy program.

Initial contact with ACCESS personnel can be made either at the hospital or at the college, says Miss Johnston. "But if prospective participants prefer to meet us in the privacy of their own homes we're willing and ready to co-operate."
