# HOSPITAL BOARD MEETING

The McCausland Hospital Board of Governors held a regular meeting on May I7, I973 with all members present. V. Mazzone, Administrator presented a report on the District Hospital Council Meeting held in Thunder Bay on May 3rd and 4th, I973. The theme of this meeting was "Role of Para-Medicals in the Delivery of Health Care in Northwestern Ontario". In keeping with this theme, the second day of the conference was held at Confederation College where mini-papers were given on the subjects of Ambulance Services, Pastoral Services Nurse Practitioner Services and Psychiatric Services.

A letter was read from the Ministry of Health confirming the fact that they will pay two-thirds (2/3) of the capital costs of the renovation of the present heating system in order to tie in with the heating plant at Birchwood Terrace Home for the Aged.

Dr. Jane Pickersgill, Medical Officer of Health and the senior staff of The Thunder Bay District Health Unit will be visiting Terrace Bay - Schreiber area on May 22, I973 and will meet with members of the Board, Administrator and Director of Nursing in the afternoon to discuss matters of mutual interest.

Rena McAdam, President of the Board, appointed members for the Standing Committees of Development, Finance and Public Relations. The Executive Committee will hold a special meeting with the Chairman of these committees to establish guidelines and objectives for the coming year.
