SCHREIBER HYDRO MUST MEET RISING COSTS

"Continuing inflation and the increasing cost of power purchased from Ontario Hydro makes it necessary for the commission to take action if it is going to maintain a reasonable financial position and continue to provide adequate service to its customers," Chairman, Gino Caccamo, said today.

Growth of the community, said Mr. Caccamo, has exceeded expectations in the past 12 months and this trend must be expected to continue. Over \$14,000.00 was spent by the Commission on capital expenditure during 1972 on the highway lighting and public school alone.

"If the commission is going to expand its system to meet these growing electrical needs, then a realistic approach is to keep pace with rising costs by rate adjustments on a current basis rather than allow inflation to get out of hand. Therefore, the commission has asked Ontario Hydro to approve a new rate structure for Schreiber," he said.
