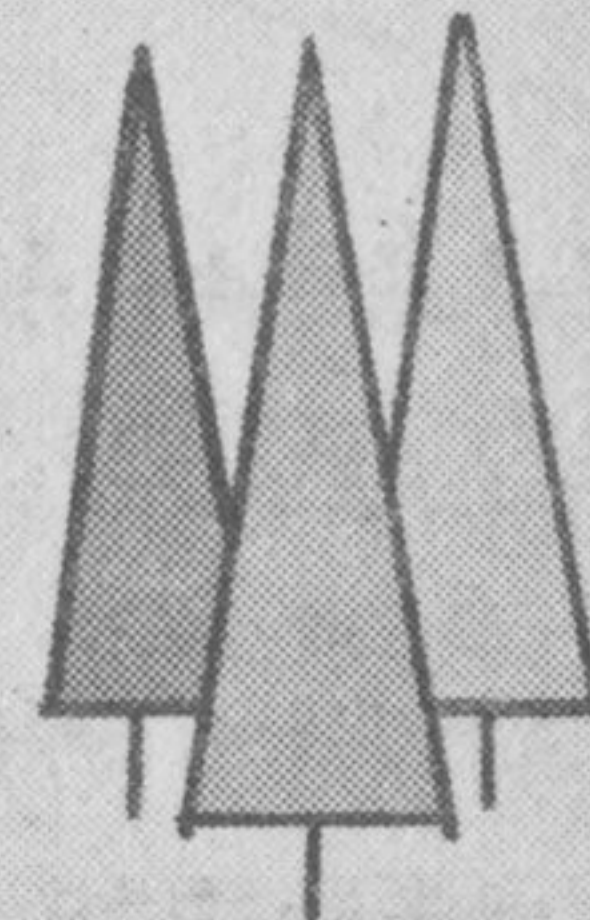

TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

Town Council met on Tuesday evening with all councillors present with the exception of W. Megraw. Minutes were adopted as read.

Correspondence included a quotation from D. Desrosiers, for rentals of trucks as needed. Mr. Desrosiers will be advised that his rates will be kept on file, for any future use of vehicles.

Dr. Jane Pickersgill, Medical Officer of Health, Thunder Bay, advised she would be in the Schreiber-Terrace Bay area on May 22nd.

The Ministry of Natural Resources advised Council that their re-organization is nearly completed, and Terrace Bay will be listed in the Terrace Bay Forest District.

The Liquor Control Board of Ontario advised that the Terrace Bay Liquor Store will now be open six days a week all year round.

The Ministry of Government Services have purchased the Slate Islands for the purpose of a Provincial Park.

The Library Board submitted the names of Mrs Ann Baron and Mr. Sonny Helmink to replace recent vacancies. Council concurred with these suggestions, and have appointed these two people to the Board. The Library Board was asked to submit a letter containing the subject matter to be discussed at a proposed meeting with Council prior to the next meeting June 12th.

A copy of a letter from the Ontario Paper Company Limited, of Manitowadge, to the Manitowadge Chamber of Commerce, was received. In this letter were stated reasons why they felt an airport, serving this area, should be built, in the region of the juncture of Highway 17 and Highway 614, known as Manitowadge corners.

ADDITION TO ST. MARTIN OFFICIAL OPENED

The official opening of the addition to St. Martin Roman Catholic School took place on Wednesday, May 16th, at 8:15 p.m. This was preceded by a Confirmation in St. Martin of Tours Church.

The addition includes a large modern gymnasium, with all the latest equipment, which will also be used as an auditorium, a well stocked library, washrooms and offices.

Mr. Michael Anderson, Principal, was Program Chairman, and opened the proceedings with the singing of O Canada, led by the 1973 Confirmation Class, led by Sister Paulette Hatfield, accompanied by Miss Celine Landry.

Invocation was given by His Excellency, Most Reverend N.J. Gallagher, Bishop of Thunder Bay.
