

6. The amount of the net expenditures allocated to each of the participating municipalities has been determined on the bases of information available. The allocations could be changed if any adjustments are made in Provincial Grants of the current or prior years.
7. The expenditures for the year includes \$43,528 (elementary schools \$15,453; secondary schools \$28,075) for capital assets not reflected on the balance sheet.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

To The Lake Superior Board of Education

We have examined the Balance Sheet of The Lake Superior Board of Education as at December 31, 1972, and the Statements of Revenue Fund—Revenue and Expenditure, Revised Net Requirement and Source and Application of Capital Funds for the year then ended. Our examination included a general review of the accounting procedures and such tests of accounting procedures and such tests of accounting records and other supporting evidence as we considered necessary in the circumstances.
