The wedding will take place on July 28, 1973 at 4 p.m. in St. Martin of Tours Church, Terrace Bay.

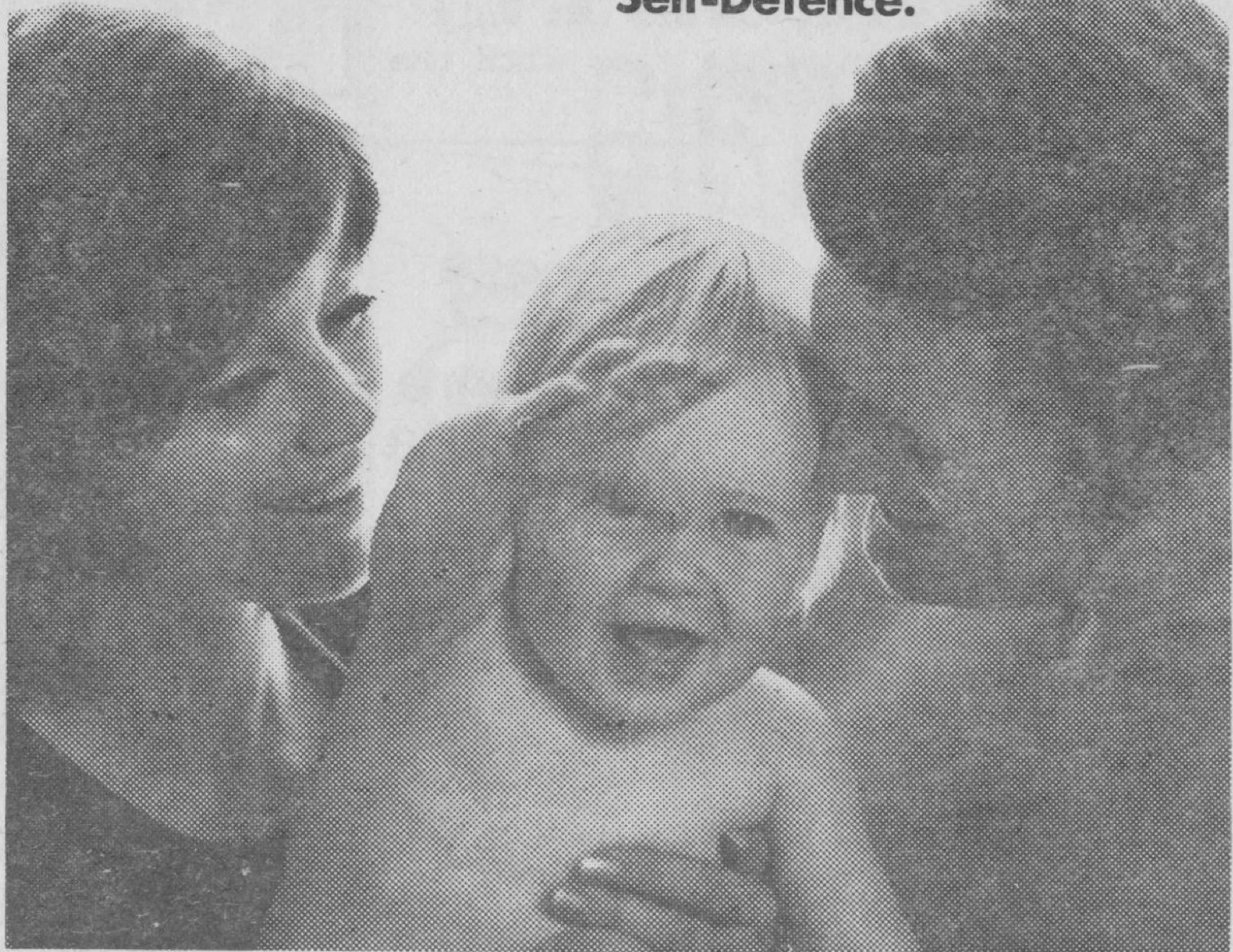
