ent drastic need for a police officer and have hired Mr. Aulenback. Chief Barnett will be notified of the proper channels to go through before any decisions in his department are made.

Councillor Hale recommended that signs for street workers at work be ordered and this was done.

A discussion took place regarding the sewage lagoon, costs of the work to be done and the need for a bulldozer for this work.

It was decided that an increased rate would be awarded for the rental of a truck which Council had tendered for, due to the costs of operation being higher than the original tender.

Council has also decided to gather information on truck speculations.

Councillor Megraw reported a broken sewer line in town and other problems sewers are causing when heavy rain is experienced.

A detailed discussion was had on supplying Mr. J. Mikus the services he will require for a motel.

Councillor Megraw and Helmink will look into equipment needed such as lawn mower, snow blower and saw and will decide on what would be the best suitable to purchase.

A photo studio has requested to purchase a monthly transient traders permit, rather than paying the yearly fee of \$100. Council felt if they make an exception for one they would have to do it for all and will notify the studio they will have to pay the yearly rate.

Two invitations for the Queen's visit were received from Thunder Bay, but no representatives from Terrace Bay are able to attend.

Council was informed that the Thunder Bay District Municipal League is considering disbanding and will write to discourage this. If this league disbands there will be no representation from Northwestern Ontario at Queens Park.

In a reply to the Library Board requesting an increase in wages of the head librarian, Council has stated their budget for the year has already been set.

THE LAKE SUPERIOR BOARD MEETING

The Lake Superior Board of Education held its regular board meeting on June 21st at Marathon High School.

Students of Grade 13, Marathon High School, who conducted a survey of "chemicals, alcohol, cigarette smoking and hash", attended by their teacher Mr. A.J. Korkola, and with Miss Debbie Henderson as their very able speaker, presented a synopsis of the background of Project C.A.S.H., its purposes, method of operation and recommendations, following which several questions invited were clearly explained by Miss Henderson.

The recommendations of the group are to be passed to the Principals' Council for study, with a report to be made to the Board.

The role of Trustees elected by Separate School Electors was discussed. These Trustees are elected for secondary school purposes. It was felt that procedures used in the past will be continued, with great care being made in the preparation of motions to keep separate elementary and secondary matters where practicable.

The Minutes of Meeting No. 5/73 held May 26th were declared adopted and the Minutes of Meeting No. 33 of the Trainable Retarded Children's Advisory Committee were acknowledged as received.
