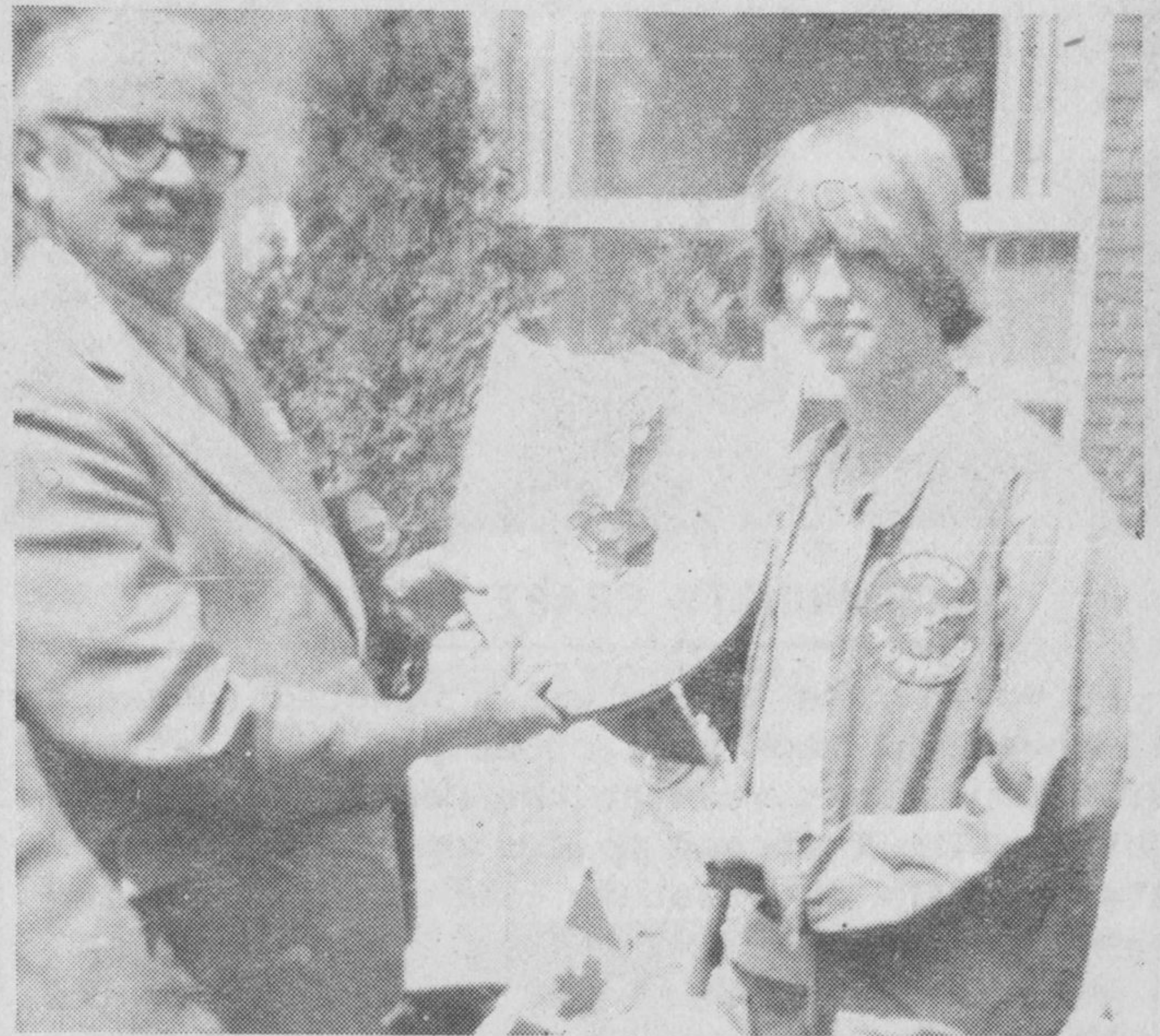
The Beer Garden and Barbeque, which took
