Beliveau's interest with the Canadiens, however, was much different than Howe's affiliation with the Red Wings. Gerry Patterson, Beliveau's lawyer, said: "Jean has a good relationship with vice-president and general manager Sam Pollock and is completely happy in Montreal."

Besides, Beliveau made his name in hockey. He was good to the game, probably better than it was to him. He played 18 years, led Canadiens to all kinds of Stanley Cups and is now a member of the Hockey Hall of Fame.

Money talks, yes. In Jean Beliveau's case, though, it didn't talk loud enough.
