INCREASES IN BENEFITS

Increases in the amount of benefits payable under Ontario's Workmen's Compensation system are expected to add approximately \$12 million a year to the total now paid to the province's injured workman and their dependents. The increases in cash benefits and in pensions became effective on July Ist under amendments to the Workmen's Compensation Act approved by the Ontario Legislature. Ontario workmen now have the highest maximum compensation levels in Canada.

These benefits apply to persons involved in accidents occuring on or after July Ist, 1973.

Among major items effected by the increases are: The earnings maximum is increased from \$9,000 to \$10,000 annually for accidents occurring on and after July I, I973.
