

CHIMO CLUB RECEIVES NEW HORIZONS GRANT

Health and Welfare Minister Marc Lalonde announced the 8th group of grants to projects under the New Horizons program. Grants to 184 projects in this series total \$1,215,933. The projects involve 28,900 people.

This group of grants brings the total to date to \$6,505,893 for 970 pro-

jects.

New Horizons was introduced as a program of the Department of National Health and Welfare in the summer of 1972. It was designed to assist retired ed men and women with projects that would benefit themselves and the community.

Under this new list, the Schreiber Chimo Senior Citizens Club - senior citizens centre will receive \$9,332.

REPLY RECEIVED ON STEEL RIVER CURVE

Mr. Jack Stokes, M.P.P. received the following reply Re-Curve West of Steel River Bridge - Highway I7 Thunder Bay District from The Ministry of Transportation and Communications, R.W. Kuhk, Regional Traffic Superintendent.

"By copy of the reply to your letter of June 18th, 1973, the Deputy Minister, Mr. A.T.C. McNab, has asked us to advise you of the findings and results of our investigation into the accident situation on the curve west of the Steel River Bridge.

Our study findings have indicated that, in spite of properly erected warning signs and curve delineation markings, motorists seem to ignore the posted advisory speeds for the continued page 2
