Council Quotes - continued

Council of a meeting held on June 28th regarding the extension of the services to the I6 lots on Lakeview Drive (Phase 4), : Present - R. Bray, W. Megraw, J. Hale, W. Hanley, Township of Terrace Bay; G.L. Puttock, C.F. Gorham Kimberly-Clark. "The cost estimate to complete the extension of Lakeview involving the servicing of I6 lots (Phase IV), was reviewed. Kimberly-Clark agreed to supply the Township with the following materials and services at no charge:

- (a) Manholes which are on hand and miscellaneous materials which will be fabricated in the mill. In addition, any clay piping remaing after present work is completed will be made available to the Township at no charge.
- (b) Field engineering and the surveying which can be carried out by mill staff this does not include surveying necessary by an O.L.S. to establish lot lines.
- (c) Equipment time, including operator, to a total of II5 hours.

It was agreed that the remaining labour and material required to complete Phase IV would be covered by the Township. Kimberly-Clark would act as contractor to complete the installation of the services and would provide field supervision and field engineering."

of July totalling \$33,550. was passed.

Notice of the N.W.O.M.A. Annual Convention to be held in Atikokan on October I2 & I3 was received with Reeve Bray, Clerk Hanley and all Councillors planning to attend.

Under new business a resolution was passed to levy on the McCausland Hospital, under section 304 of the Municipal Act an amount up to \$50 on the capacity of the institution. The McCausland Hospital has a capacity of 2I.

An increase in salary for Police Chief Barnett was passed with his anniversary date being set at August Ist of each year.

It was moved that 75% of the moving costs for Constables Sturgeon and Aulenback be paid by the township. Constable Aulenback has also been promoted to 3rd class.

The expenditures of the I973 budget were reviewed with the overall opinion being expressed that things are "looking good".

A lengthy discussion was held on the actual finished appearance of the present expansion of the cemetery. Councillor Hale felt this matter had already been dealt with at great length and will continue with the present outlines.
