Dr. Potter said that because of the difficulties in the north due to climatic conditions communications and travel, and because the socio-economic conditions are different from those in the larger centres, many gaps in service exist.

"It's here that the people can be a driving force, working with the regional centre to plan to meet the needs of the area, to set the priorities, and to help change the direction of health care delivery," Dr. Potter said. "They can help achieve an effective efficient, economical and comprehensive health care program for the District of Thunder Bay."

Dr. James C. Baldwin is the area co-ordinator for the northern region of Ontario. He intends to work very closely with the District

Health Councils, particularly in the early stages of development, to work out the best method of meeting local needs through effective use of all the resources available to them. Dr. Baldwin expects to be in the area about the middle of September to discuss the council with local communities.

Dr. Baldwin is particularly anxious to see that the District of Thunder Bay be one of the first to establish a District Health Council in Ontario. "I want the province to see that we have in the north a dedicated, effective group that can lead the way in health care delivery."
