electrical commissions, purchasing electrical power at cost price from Ontario Hydro, has kept the public in control of the system, Mr. Alexander added.

It will be part of the OMEA's job to ensure that the recently announced energy policy "does not degenerate into political interference."

The policy, he said, should be only broad guide—lines under which Ontario Hydro can best function for the benefit of municipal customers.

The OMEA, along with government and industry will have an expanded role in increasing public understanding about Ontario Hydro matters, said Mr. Alexander.

The association might also be required to act as an intervener in rate review hearings conducted by the new Energy Board. And it could be the spokesmen for municipal views about government policy relating to electrical energy.

It is "essential" that the OMEA influences Ontario Hydro policy decisions, especially those affecting municipal electrical customers, he said.
