Apart from wheat and flour, we are not making specific recommendations at this time but we shall not hesitate to do so if our investigations show that serious increases in consumer prices of staple foods are, or seem likely to be, involved.

The recommendations made above can lighten the burden of the low-income family but will not eliminate it. Because of our concern that children must have adequate nutrition, we str-
