want anything going through their property. After some discussion of this problem the final statement by Council was they intend to leave the matter entirely alone and wait and see what reaction is received.

A letter from A. Donald Ferris, Barrister-Solicitor, representing Aldon's Midtown Limited with regards to a mobile home development in Terrace Bay was left for an "in camera" meeting.

Minutes of the meeting of the Terrace Bay Public Library Board held September 12th were submitted. These were passed but Council had a few questions and would request a Library representative attend Councils next meeting.

A letter from the Ministry of Community and Social Services outlining a proposal for appointments to boards of district homes for the aged was received. Under this proposal seven members of such a board would be appointed by the province and five be chosen by participating municipalities. Schreiber and Terrace Bay are listed to share one representative.

A list of uncollectable taxes were presented under new business totalling \$37,097.94 and Council moved to right off these taxes.

A complaint had been received regarding the condition of the washrooms at the Recreation Centre Arena during the Labour Day Dance.

Police Chief Barnett and Councillor Brassard were authorized to attend the Zone I meet-

ing of Police Chiefs on October 26th.

The condition at the railway station due to box cars being swept out was brought to Councils attention. The main concern was that this pile of grain could bring in rats. The Health Inspector will be contacted to look into this.

It was reported that the sewer and water material for the Red Dog Inn was slow in arriving and difficulty is being had in obtaining some of this material. Council is doing their best to obtain the required fittings as soon as possible.

Garbage is a popular subject at Council meetings lately and again a discussion was held on the condition of the land fill site and the number of pick-ups in the town site. It was reported Marathon is presently doing a study of the area with regards to weekly pick-ups, etc. and Council will obtain a copy of this to give them more information.

A complaint was received about the pile up of debris behind the theatre. Since the new manager is new in town a letter will be sent regarding this.

Ontario Hydro notified Council they have a surplus house in town. Council stated they have no use for the house.

Council adjourned their regular meeting and went into camera for the duration.
