ies and business establishments have instituted this plan for their employees as an easy and convenient way for them to reach a savings target and invest in a safe, profitable security.

The employee simply places an order with his employer for the amount of Canada Savings Bonds he wishes to purchase. Each pay day a specific amount of money is deducted from his wages or salary to pay for the bonds. These payments are usually spread over a I2-month period.
