- Item: Please bring one deck of cards per person for the match.

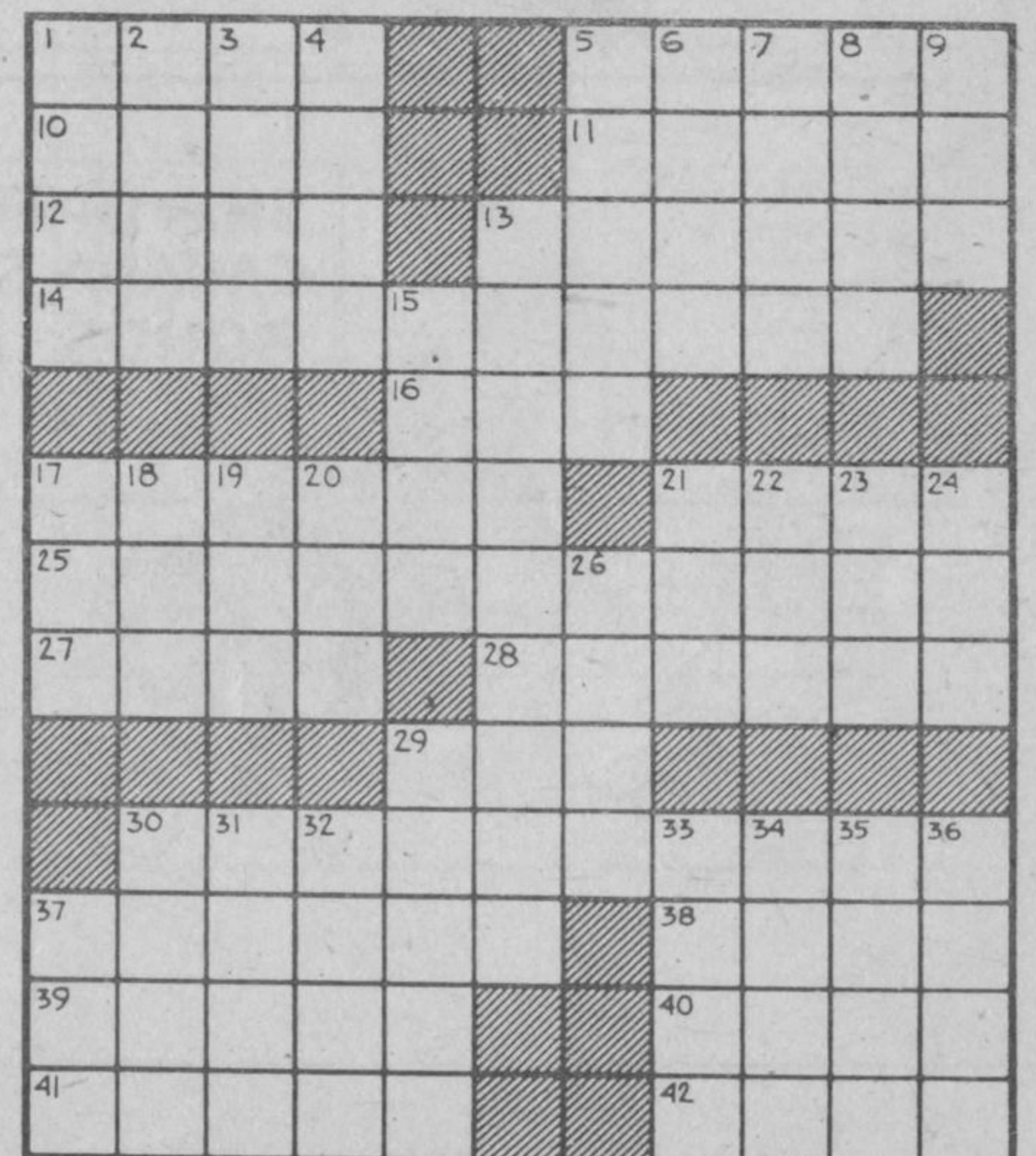
