HOSPITAL BUDGET TIME IS HERE

How does your Hospital Board arrive at their Annual Budget? The Administrator calculates the actual cost of the first nine months of the current year and then projects as estimate for the final three months of the year. Probable price increases for 1974 are then estimated and a salary survey is done before arriving at 1974 salary levels. The complete 1974 Operating Budget is drawn up and reviewed by the Budget Committee, then by the full Board at a special Budget Meeting. Once approved by the Board it is sent to the Ministry of Health for final approval. The total amount being divided into semi-monthly cash payments to the hospital.

In 1973 the total Operating Budget is 222,561.00. The daily ward rate per patient is \$55.80.

To date, the hospital is operating slightly over the budget but also has an increase in patient days over the amount budgeted. This situation brings up some interesting questions:
