TERRACE BAY POLICE DEPARTMENT REPORT

A total of 18 occurrences were investigated during the past week by the Terrace Bay Police Department.

On October 22nd, a complaint was received regarding damage to a light fixture of the new addition to the Public School. Damage was estimated at \$440.00. Two 15 year olds have been charged with this offence.

Also during the weekend damage was caused to an ornamental light fixture at the Home for the Aged. Two juveniles have been charged with this offence. It was previously reported, on October 13th that the home of a local resident had been broken into and a quantity of property stolen. Two local youths have been charged with this offence and a further youth may be charged with receiving part of the stolen property.

During the week a Toronto man was charged with fraudulently using a Royal Bank of Canada Chargex card at a business establishment in Terrace Bay.

Six motor vehicles were safety checked, four citations issued and two minor thefts reported.

Numerous complaints had been received regarding the misuse of the Bell Telephone System. These calls appear to have been young boys and girls. Should such misuse continue investigators of the Bell Telephone System will be notified and the offending party will be traced and charged. Along with any court penalty the telephone will be removed from the home of the culprit.
