INFORMATION ONTARIO

The Third Annual Conference of Ontario's Northern Affairs Officers will take place in the Parliament Buildings, Toronto, November 8 and 9.

In explaining that the purpose was to review operations and plan improvements in service, Natural Resources Minister, Leo Bernier stated 'being a Northern oriented agency, meetings of this branch are usually held regionally in Northern Ontario, but once a year they are assembled in Toronto so that the officers may meet with the senior people in the various Ministries that they serve'.

The Northern Affairs Branch provides a link between the people of Northern Ontario and all branches of government with respect to the availability of government services.

If you wantonly kill a timber rattler in Ontario you can be liable under The Endangered Species Act to a \$3,000 fine or a prison term of up to six months.

are remote. In Ontario, the last officially recorded timber was in I94I and the last known fatality was a soldier bitten by one, back in I8I2.

Another snake - the blue racer - and two birds of prey - the peregrine falcon and bald eagle - have been listed, along with the timber rattler, as endangered species.

The two reptiles and two birds are being threatened with extinction and the penalty applies to anyone who contravenes the Act which is administered in this province by the Ministry of Natural Resources.

NOTICE KIMBERLY-CLARK POLICY RE: CLEARING DRIVEWAYS

It is the intention of Kimberly-Clark to discontinue the clearing of driveways by the Winter of 1974-75, except for those people who are involved in emergency services to the Mill or Town.

As a step towards this and in order to reduce the amount of snow clearing this year, the clearing of driveways by Kimberly-Clark will be restricted to - Kimberly-Clark employees and Kimberly-Clark pensioners (over 65) and widows of employees and those people providing essential services to the Town (these were the people whose driveways were cleared the night of the storm in previous years).

Anyone who is included in the above category who wishes to have their driveway cleared on a continuous basis may do so by filling in an application at the Watchman's Station.

As in the past, you will be billed once per year (April) for the number of times your driveway is cleared at \$3.00 per clearing.

Driveways will be cleared only when equipment is available

In order to avoid damage to snowblowers or your property, please remove any objects from your driveway that could be chopped up or thrown by the snow blower.
