Brunelle Reply - cont'd

"I am pleased to be able to advise you that further to your question during debates on Estimates of our Ministry, on October 22nd, 1973, about compensating grants in lieu of tax—es lost by the Municipality of Terrace Bay, we have had a favourable response in this respect from the Ministry of Treasury, Economics and Intergovernmental Affairs.

The Subsidies Officer in T.E.I.G.A. here in Queen's Park, had in fact written in late September to the Commercial and Industrial Valuation Manager of the Thunder Bay-Kenora-Rainy River Assessment Office of the Ministry of Revenue, in Thunder Bay, advising him that in their opinion the property could be included on the valuation listing for I973 payments in lieu of taxes, except for those tenanted portions which may be subject to Section 26 of The Assessment Act.

This, you will recall, was the explanation given by our Director of Homes for the Aged - Office on Aging Branch, Mrs. Lawrence Crawford, in response to your question before the Committee, on October 22nd, I973, particularly page SI937 of the Debates for that day in the Standing Committee on Supply.

I am sure that you will be pleased with this development which, as we indicated was being worked on, and will convey the news to the Town of Terrace Bay Municipal representatives. I am sharing copies of my correspondence with the present District Board of Management for Homes for the Aged in Thunder Bay, as well, and our Regional Administrator, Mr. M.L. Graver.


