

LEGION MIXED BOWLING

INCREASE IN MINIMUM WAGE

Labour Minister Fern Guindon announced in the legislature on November 1st., that a minimum wage of \$2.00 an hour for employees in general industry will become effective throughout Ontario on January 1, 1974. Present rate of \$1.80 became effective February 1, 1973. ✓

The minimum rate will apply to all employees except students under the age of 18. The student rate will be \$1.65 per hour.

The minimum rate for construction employees will increase from \$2.05 to \$2.25. Guards on construction sites will receive the same rate. continued page 12
