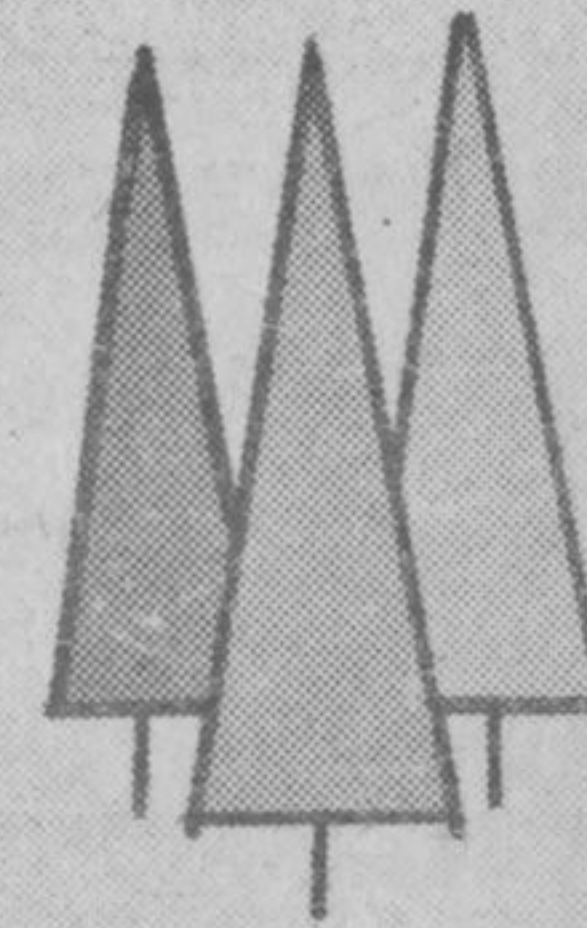

TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

The November 13th meeting of Township Council was opened with Reeve Roy Bray in the chair and Councillors Brassard, Hale, Helmink and Megraw present.

It being two weeks since Council met last, they quickly moved to pass their last meeting minutes held October 23rd and later passed the October 1st Library Board and October 18th Recreation Committee minutes.

Business arising from the previous Council minutes dealt with the inauguration of a two week pay period for township employees. At this stage the commencement date of January 1, 1974 has been set with further information on this system still to be obtained.

The question of cemetery fencing being ordered was also questioned with a reply given that a quotation is being sought on 4' II gage fencing.

Correspondence submitted: A letter from the Terrace Bay Boy Scouts requesting permission to sell Christmas cards. Permission was granted.

A letter from the Ministry of Community and Social Services, The Hon. Rene Brunelle to Jack Stokes M.P.P. Thunder Bay regarding a grant in lieu of taxes for Birchwood Terrace (similarly published in the November 7th issue of the News). Council brought out at this time that the grant would be an annual one.

A letter from the Hydro-Electric Power Commission of Ontario advised the township of rate increases. A 7½ per cent increase will be charged to Terrace Bay.

A letter from Mr. and Mrs. Paul Rochon terminating their lease of the Recreation Snack Bar effective January 1, 1974 was received.
