

Councillor Brassard will take this matter up with the Police Department.

He also asked if there was a by-law in town to cover children under the age of I6 being in public after a certain time in the evening. Clerk Hanley replied this was covered under the Child Welfare Act and as long as a child is with someone over I6 they are covered.

Councillor Hale made the suggestion that in order to conserve energy this year people should be encouraged to use more displays and less lights for their Christmas decorations. The word "Sparkle" will be deleted from this years contest advertisement and "Christmas Decorative Display" inserted. The Hydro Commission will continue to sponsor this yearly contest.

Spruce leaves remain on the tree five years or more.


