ball's National League for five years. All told, Montreal major league teams (the Canadiens and the Expos) have had nine winning years and 12 losing years for a .429 percentage.

And guess who's second on the list .....

Green Bay! Right ... Green Bay Packers of the National Football League, who have won five championships and didn't win anything the other 10 years they were in the NFL, for a .333 percentage.

Miami, with the Dolphins having won two Super Bowls in their seven years in the NFL,

rate third with a .286 percentage. Fourth is Toronto, with the Maple Leafs having won four Stanley Cups in the past 16 years (4-12) for a .250 percentage.

Boston, which also has entries in the four major league sports, has captured more national titles than any other city, having won in everything but football in the past 16 years. All told, Boston teams were 13 and 50 over that time, the basketball Celtics taking care of most of those 13 championships. Fifty times, however, their major league teams lost, so Boston's record stands at .206, for fifth place.

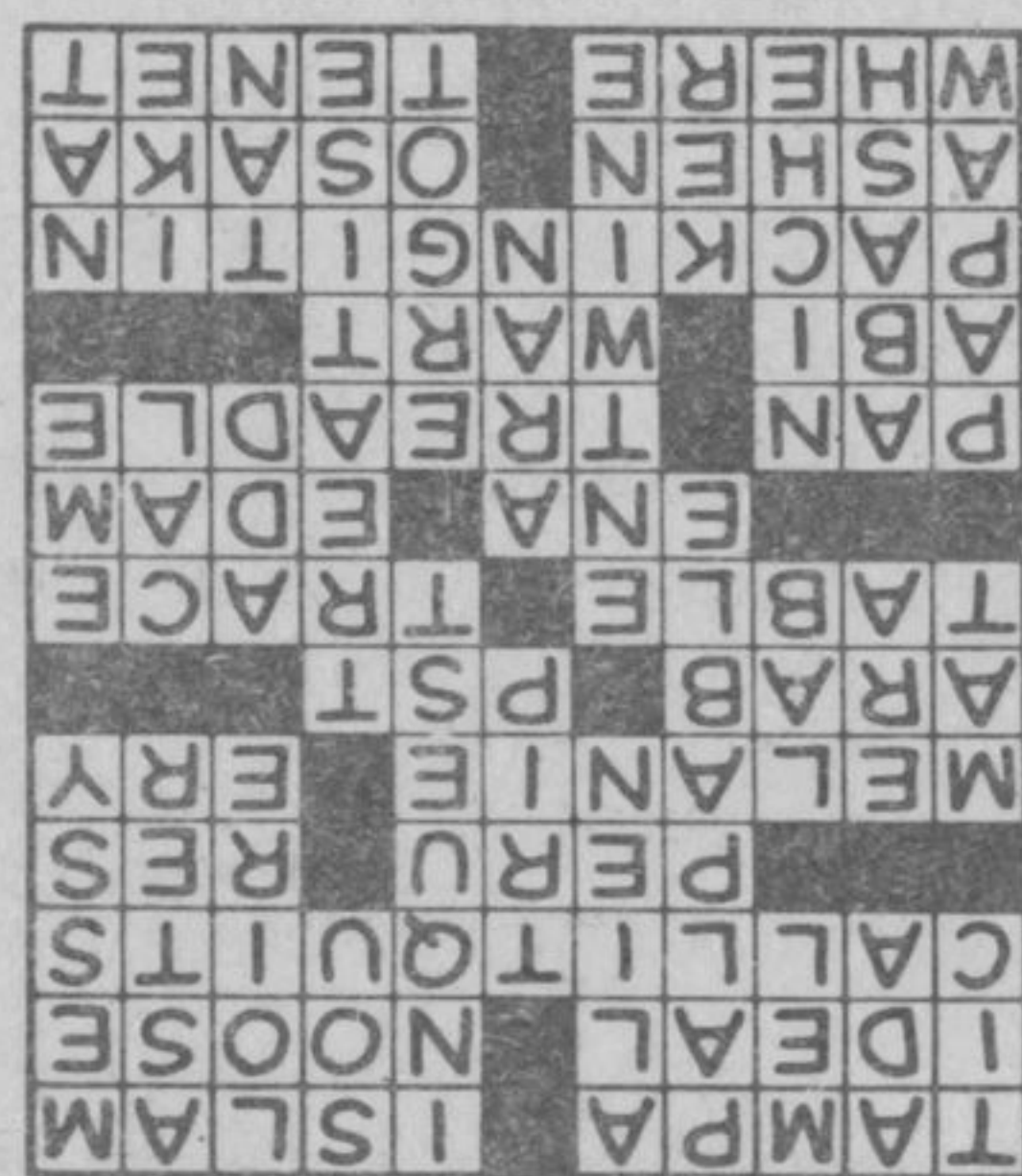
New York ranks second in most crowns with 11, that taken care of mostly by the Yankees of yesteryear, but with 78 losses all told rank eight with a .124 percentage.

Detroit writers blame their sports teams' lacklustre performances in the past 16 years to inferior talent. But those same writers blame inferior management for that inferior talent.

"Detroit lacks foresight in the procurement of young players. That failing is the essence of Detroit's failure to produce championship caliber teams," wrote one scribe. In the Red Wings' case, he's probably right at least since Ned Harkness and Jim Biship got into the front office.

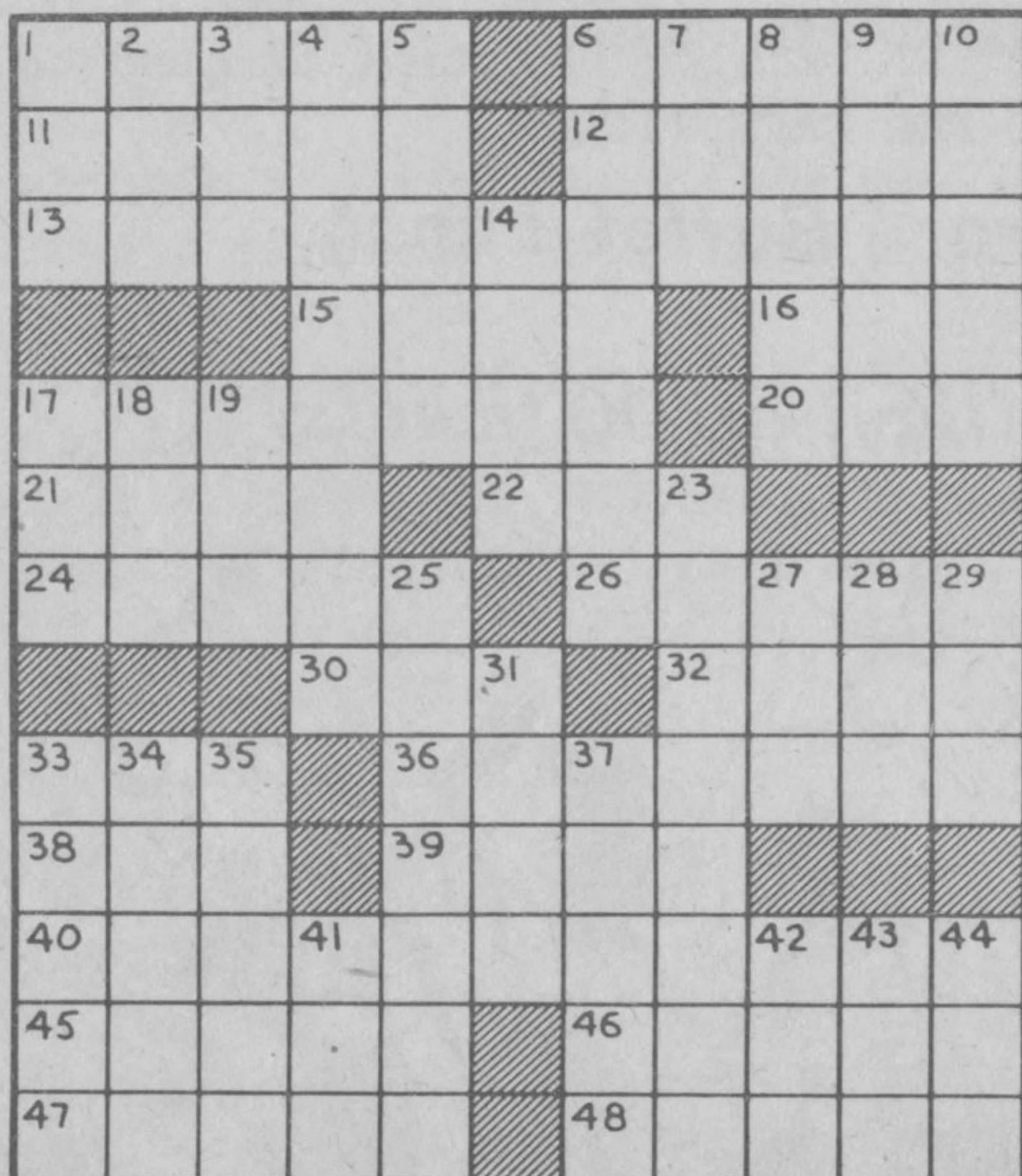
