RENEWAL REGISTRATION WILL GO ON SALE

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications has announced that commencing December 1, 1973 renewal registration for passenger motor vehicles and trailers will go on sale at 284 Licence Issuing Offices throughout the Province. As in 1973, the fees are \$23 for a 4-cylinder vehicle; \$32 for 6-cylinders; \$40 for an 8-cylinder car and \$5 for trailers.

This year marks the first time that Ontario will be issuing a licence plate sticker instead of new plates to signify that the vehicle owner has paid his annual registration fee.

No new permit will be issued for renewal -- the present permit will be used for five years.

Under the new system motorists will not be required to fill in an application as in the past, but rather need only present their permit with the fee to the issuer. The issuer will then ask the motorist to sign an insurance
