declaration and will return the multi-year permit on which he has affixed a sticker. He will also provide another sticker the motorist will be required to attach to the plate on the rear of his vehicle.

This new system is similar to those presently in use in 30 other jurisdictions across North America.

FOREST MANAGEMENT IN THE TERRACE BAY DISTRICT

The Ministry of Natural Resources' Terrace Bay District covers our area of approximately 5,000 square miles. It is bounded by Lake Superior in the south and the village of Stevens in the north. It extends eastward from the Gravel River to White Lake Provincial Park.

Most of the Crown Land Timber rights in the District are licenced to the wood using industry excepting the Steel River Management unit which is unlicenced.

The Ontario Paper Company Limited, American Can of Canada Limited, Kimberly-Clark of Canada Limited, Weldwood of Canada Limited, and the St. Lawrence Corporation (Domtar) hold short and long term Timber licences in the District under the authority of the Crown Timber Act. These companies harvest timber for the manufacture of wood products in their mills in Thorold, Marathon, Terrace Bay, Longlac and Red Rock.

The bulk of the Kimberly-Clark Licence is located in the Geraldton District, whereas the greater part of the American Can Licence is located in the Terrace Bay District. This is one of the factors making Manitouwadge the geographic centre for our forest management activities. Because of this, all of the District forest management staff are located in Manitouwadge rather than Terrace Bay.

One of the Ministry's objectives is to manage our forests, as a source of raw material for the wood using industry. Forest management must also meet recreational and environmental needs. We attempt to carry out these tasks by controlling the size and location of harvest operations, providing lake and stream shoreline reserves, ensuring proper wood utilization and promoting regeneration (a new tree crop) on cutover areas.

To obtain regeneration on cutover areas, the Ministry has carried out the following regeneration work in the Terrace Bay District this year:

Scarification for planting, seeding, etc. 1,788 acres. cont'd next column .....

Scarification for natural regeneration

	614 acres
Prescribed burning for planting	1,100 acres
Direct seeding of jackpine and spruce	691 acres
Tree planting	1,825,000 trees

Regeneration work of this type is carried out from Spring to Fall by the Ministry and by some of the pulp and paper companies who carry out this work under an agreement with the Ministry.
