A letter of thanks will be sent to the T.B. Association in Schreiber for serviettes. A small donation will accompany same.

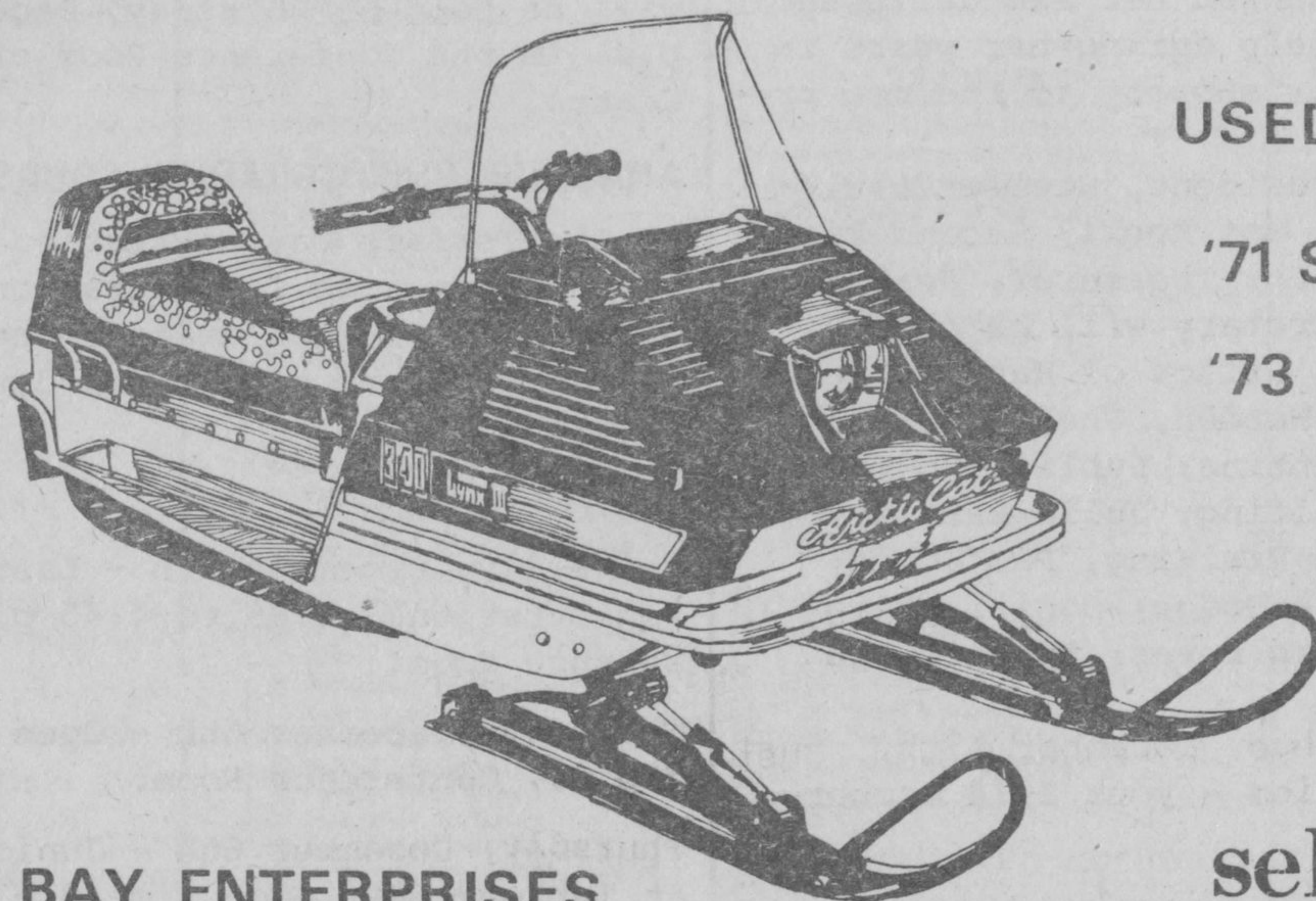
Volunteers are needed to work at the next bingo to be held on December 17th.
