

LICENCE PLATE RENEWAL STICKERS

The Ministry of Transportation and Communications has announced that to date only 3.8 per cent of Ontario motorists have purchased their licence plate renewal stickers. At the same time last year over 10 per cent of the plates had been sold.

The renewal stickers have been on sale at 29I issuing offices throughout the province since the first of December and Ministry officials are concerned that if the number of motorists applying for renewal does not soon increase, it will be impossible to avoid line -ups at the end of February.

Present multi-year plates must be validated by applying the sticker to the lower right-hand corner of the rear plate prior to midnight, February 28.

Those applying for renewal will be asked to fill out an insurance form available at the issuing offices and hand it, along with the ownership permit and fee, to the issuing agent. The validation sticker will then be issued along with complete instructions as to the method of applying to the plate.

As in 1973, fees are \$23 for a 4-cylinder vehicle; \$32 for 6-cylinders; \$40 for an 8cylinder car and \$5 for trailers.

STOKES ANNOUNCED COMMUNITY GRANTS
