On Saturday, January 26th, Local 665, United Paperworkers International Union, honoured five retiring members of it's local.

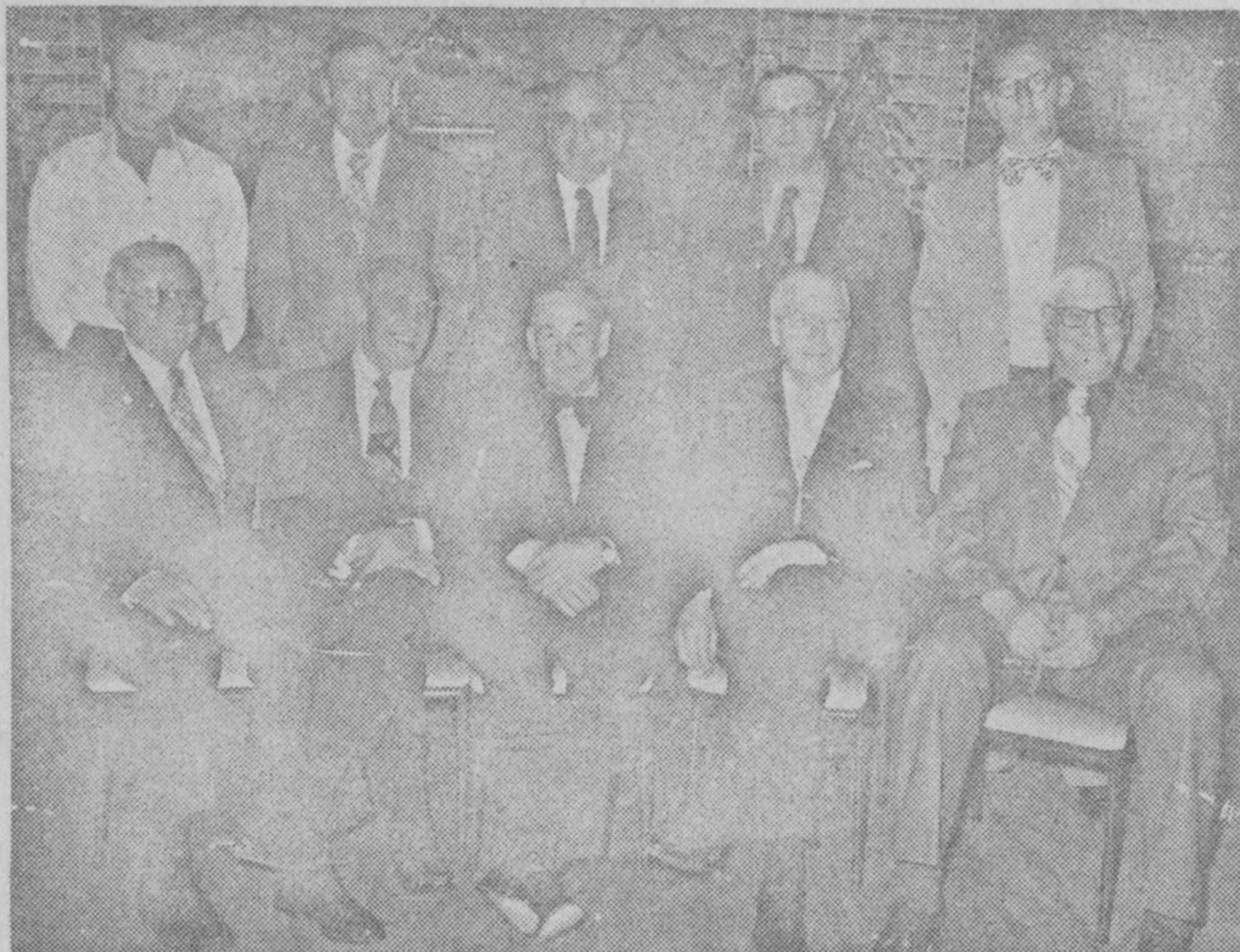

Wind System

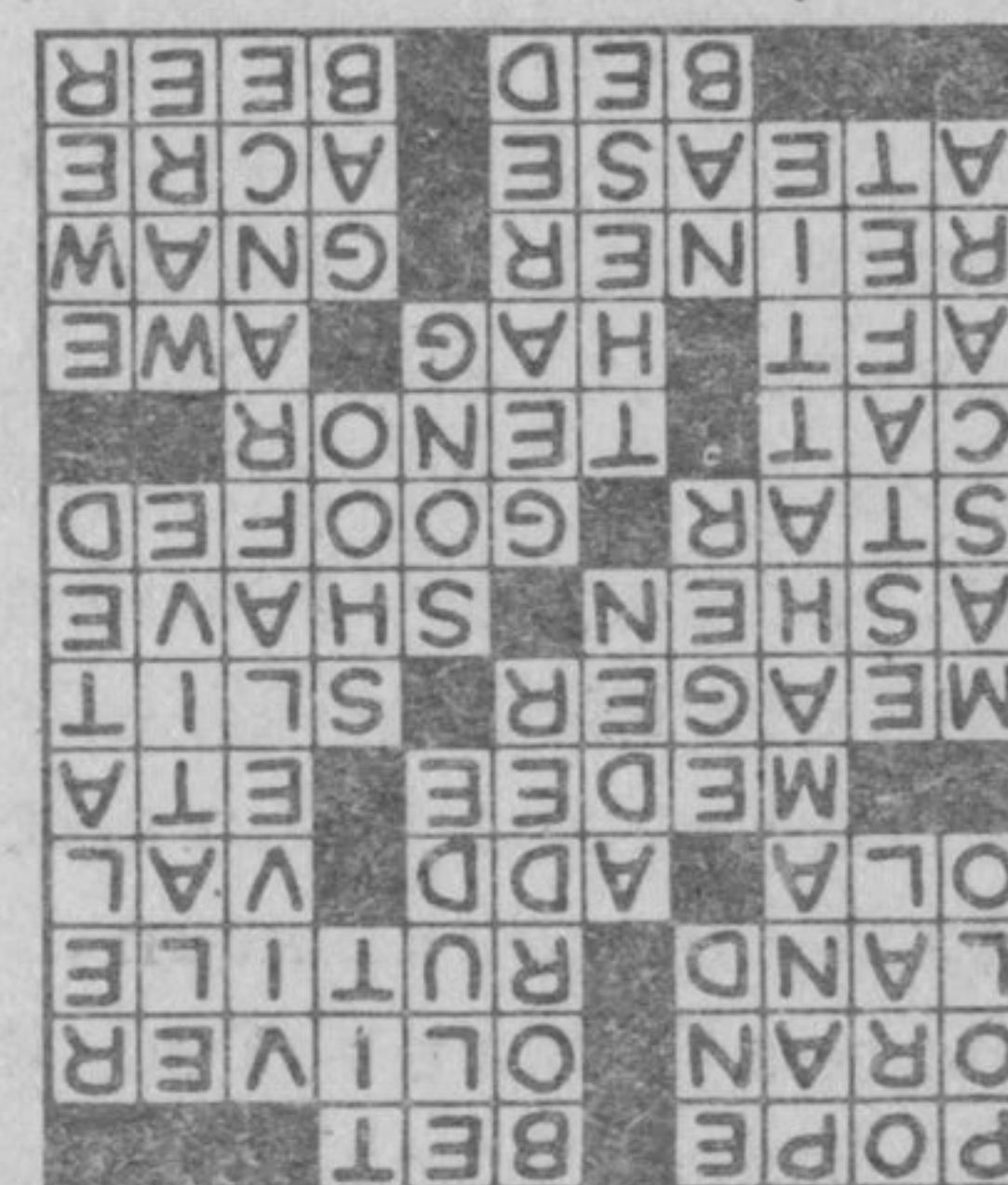
