

TERRACE BAY COUNCIL QUOTES

Terrace Bay Town Council met on Tuesday with Reeve Bray presiding and all Councillors present.

Minutes were adopted as read.

Correspondence included an acknowledgement from the Ministry of Solicitor General - P.E. Werk re Peacetime Emergency Plan.

A notice of an annual meeting for A.M.E.U. District 3, April I6-I7, in Thunder Bay was received.

A letter from the Board of Governors of McCausland Hospital requesting financial aid for capital assistance was received. The Schreiber Council will be contacted on this matter.

The Ministry of Social Services advised of the results of the election to the Child Welfare Budget Board. Terrace Bay Council approved application made by the Manitouwadge Improvement District to District Judge to have the determination of members of the Lake Superior Board of Education Separate School Trustees set aside, and a new determination to be made in accordance with the Secondary School Board of Education Act. The effect of such an application will have the Separate School Trustees elected within their own municipality, instead of having the four members elected at large. Terrace Bay would have I, Schreiber I, Manitouwadge 2.

Council was asked to consider approval for Supplementary Road Expenditures (for construction), in the amount of \$22,000. Approval was given, and submitted to the Ministry of Transportation and Communications.
