NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

ENVIRONMENTAL

HEARING BOARD

TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER

WHEREAS plans and an engineer's report concerning a Provincial sewage treatment works to serve the Township of Schreiber have been developed for the Ontario Ministry of the Environment and whereas approval is required in accordance with Section 42 of The Ontario Water Resources Act;

AND WHEREAS it appears from an examination of the said plans that the proposed works will be located in the vicinity of part of mining location Plan E-196, Township 84, in the Township of Schreiber;

NOW THEREFORE this is to give notice that the Environmental Hearing Board shall, on the 4th day of April, 1974 at 1 o'clock in the afternoon at the Municipal Office, 302 Scotia Street, Schreiber, Ontario, hold a public hearing pursuant to Section 44(I) of the said Act. The purpose of the hearing is to enable the Board to obtain information and to hear the views expressed at the hearing so as to enable it to form an opinion on the merits as to whether the use and operation of the proposed site would or would not be in the public interest.

And Take Notice that if you do not attend at this hearing the Environmental Hearing Board may proceed in your absence, and you will not be entitled to any further notice of the proceedings.

Plans of the proposed sewage works will be available for inspection in the office of the municipal clerk of the TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER, 302 Scotia Street, Schreiber, Ontario.
