Briefly these are: clear a circle to the mineral soil, keep the fire small, put it dead out before leaving. If it is necessary to set a fire for other reasons, a Forest Officer may issue a Fire Permit for this purpose. These may be obtained from any Ministry of Natural Resources office.

(2) Work Permits: Where extensive work is to be carried on in forest areas in the summer, a Work Permit is required. These are issued from Ministry offices upon receipt of an Application for Work Permit and are subject to local regulations.

(3) Restricted Zones: If the weather is hot, dry and a high fire danger exists, travel in forest areas may be curtailed. This is done by order of the Minister. We then have what we call a Restricted Zone. Again what does this mean? There are two types of restricted zones. In the first type, travel is still permitted but no open fires are allowed. To cook or obtain warmth, it is necessary to use a portable stove or charcoal installations. The second type of restricted zone is used during very severe conditions. It restricts travel completely in the restricted zone. If during this condition, one finds it necessary to travel through the restricted zone, a Travel

Permit may be issued by a Forest Officer.

In this District Travel and Fire Permits are issued at our offices in Terrace Bay and Manitouwadge. Fire Permits are also issued at the Northern Affairs office in Marathon.

May we again appeal for your assistance in reporting all forest fires. The phone number at Manitouwadge is 826-3225 and in Terrace Bay 825-3205. We accept collect calls. You have been most co-operative in the past, for which we are grateful. In fact, last year in this District all of the fires were reported by you - the public. Have an enjoyable summer. The woods are yours to enjoy. Please help us Prevent Forest Fires.
