VISIT TO FRANCE

The Ministry of Education is seeking 24 young people to take part in a three week visit to France in June.

The Ministry's Educational Exchange and special projects branch will pay the groups air fare from Montreal to Paris. While in France they will be the guests of the French Government and will be billeted in private homes and youth hostels. Visiting across the country they will observe first hand the cultural economic and political aspects of France.

Applicants must be between 18 and 25 years of age and have a good command of spoken French. They also must have been active in community affairs. The applicants will be selected from across Ontario and will represent the academic business technical and agricultural interests.

Application forms are available from cultural exchange programs, Ministry of Education 15th Floor, Mowat Block, Toronto M7A 1L5. The forms must be completed and returned by May 3rd.

In August a group of 24 French visitors will arrive in Ontario to complete the exchange program.

Applicants should write in for the forms preferably in French.
