The Thunder Bay Canadians won the Consolation event with a 6-4 win over the short staffed Schreiber Legion team in the tournament's final game. The Fort Frances team were presented with the C.W. COX Trophy emblematic of the Bantam Champions of Northwestern Ontario.

Each team member was also presented individual crests on behalf of the Schreiber Minor Hockey Association, who also presented individual crests to the Thunder Bay Canadians.
