From noon to 2:00, "Radio Noon", now hosted by Al Maitland, will be replaced by "Radio Noon" from Thunder Bay, hosted by Bill Logan.

From 4:00 to 6:00, now "Northern Ontario Roundup" with Jim Robertson, Rick Kyle will be the host.
