The City of Mississauga submitted a resolution requesting provincial aid for Fire Services and asking Council to endorse said resolution. This will come up for further discussion at a later date.

A letter was received, too late, from the Association for the Mentally Retarded requesting Council to proclaim the week of May 12-19 as Mental Health Week, and to take note of the Flowers of Hope campaign.

Notice was received of Zone 9 Municipal Clerks meeting to be held in Thunder Bay on May 31st. Clerk-treasurer W. Hanley was authorized to attend.

Notice was received of a Road Superintendents seminar to be held in Thunder Bay June 4-5.

A meeting of the Northwestern Ontario Municipal Advisory committee will be held for Northwestern Ontario, on May 25th, in Thunder Bay. Reeve Bray will attend.

The Building Inspector's report was read.

Township accounts passed for payment were: \$34,193.35; Hydro \$16,470.77; Library \$1,522.31; Recreation \$7,561.37.

Under new business, approval of the S.E.I.U. Local 268, settlement was approved.

A lengthy discussion took place over the final draft agreement regarding the heating of McCausland Hospital and the Recreation Centre by Birchwood Terrace.

Councillor Peggy Helmink, representing

Committee, stated the swim pool was cleaned and ready for painting.

Councillor Hale suggested the Cemetery road should be widened and overhanging brush cleared away.

Reeve Bray stated that the Kinsmen Club of Terrace Bay had expressed the desire to plan the activities for Canada Day, which has till now been the responsibility of the Recreation Committee. A tentative program and the need for financial assistance will be discussed at the next meeting.
