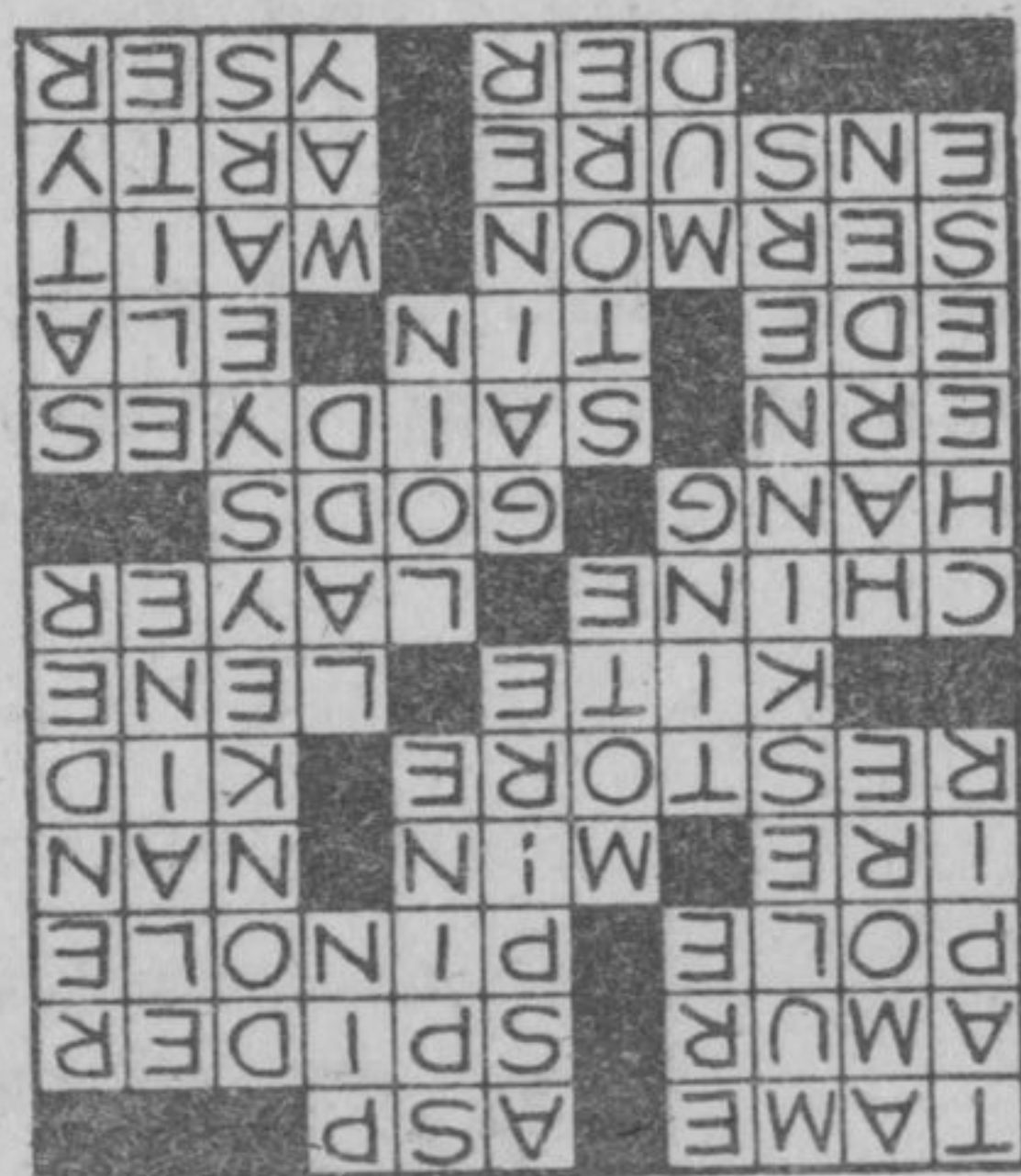
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Word has been received of the death of Mr. Jos. C. Belliveau of Church Point, Nova Scotia.

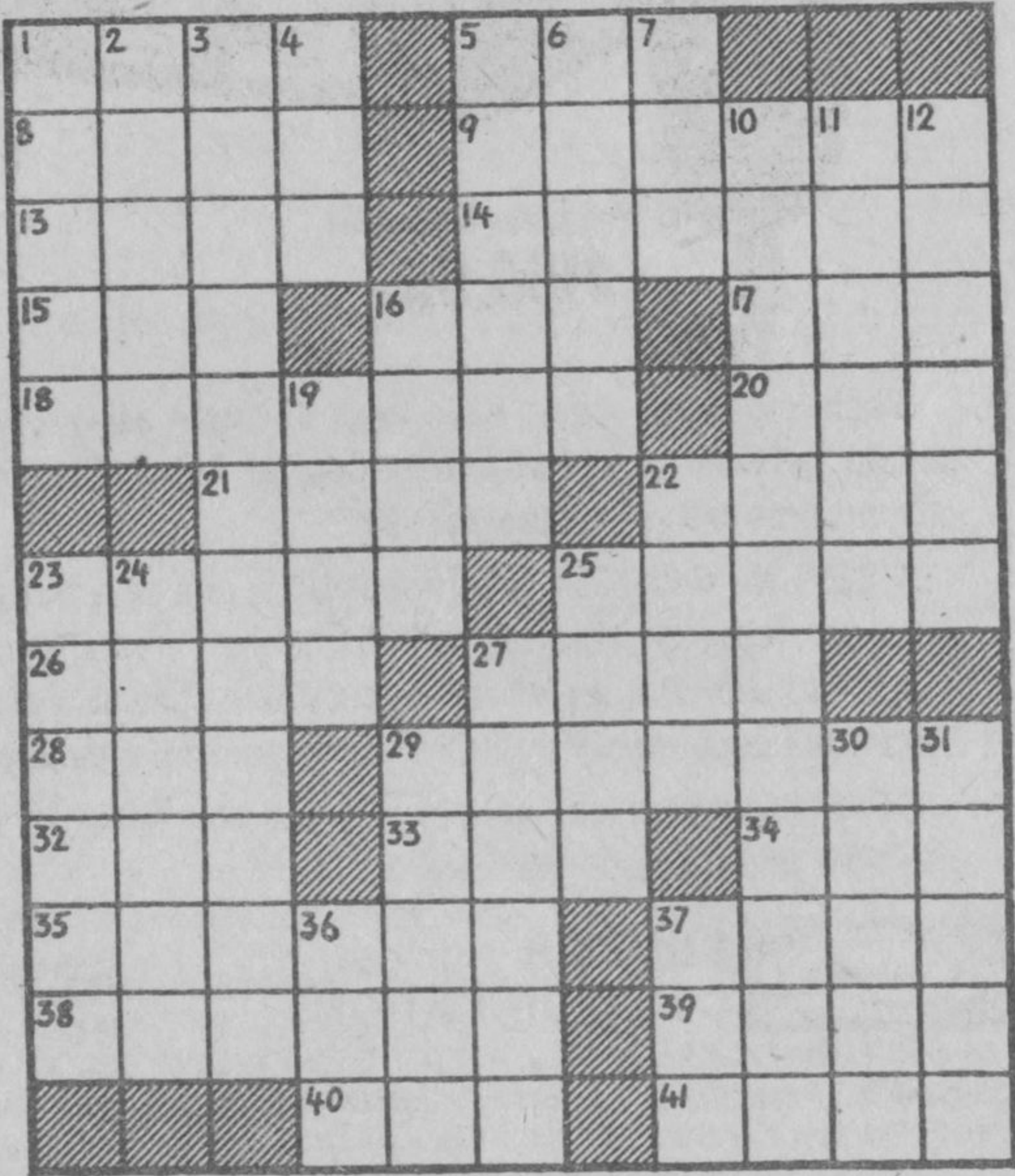
