

## SCHREIBER COUNCIL QUOTES

The Municipal Council, at their May 13th meeting, expressed gratification that, following a special meeting earlier in the month, their offer of \$10,000 to Crown Assets, has been accepted - only legal formalities to be completed, for the purchase of the former post office, which they intend using as a medical centre, this facility also being in the centre of the town.

The contract for necessary renovations has been given to M. Cebrario and Sons, local contractors, with the injunction to start the work as soon as possible.

A group of ratepayers attended the meeting to inquire into regulations concerning the placing of mobile homes. Two of these requested permission to re-locate, since they have been asked to move their units from their present location.

Council will study the problem and notify those concerned of their decision.

At a later point in the meeting council discussed the possibility of the town establishing a trailer court.

McCausland Hospital Board, acknowledged gratefully a donation of \$725.00 toward the hospital share of capital renovations.

An invitation was received from Pinewood Court Board, to attend the formal opening of the Birchwood Crescent Home in Terrace Bay this month - the clerk asked to forward a copy to the Chimo Club for further action, and council agreed to send a flower arrangement to mark the occasion.

M.M. Dillon's Limited, statement of account, in the amount of \$1,985.61, re storm drainage, was passed for payment.

A letter from the Ministry T.E.I.A. in connection with Senior Citizen Housing stated further details will be sent to councillor N.A. McCuaig.

L. Doucet, by letter, requested permission to re-locate his mobile home within the community.

The Mayor of Kenora sent an invitation to attend the N.W.O.M. meeting being held there October 3-5.

Dr. James E. Baldwin, acknowledged Reeve McParland's query regarding facilities for McCausland Hospital, stating the matter is now being investigated by his Department.

In answer to council's request to Marathon Realty, to purchase additional ground, adjacent to the cemetery, it was stated further investigation is required.

The Thunder Bay District Health Unit, sent a report of additional facilities they

consider are needed in the washrooms in the local arena.

Clerk A.J. Gauthier was asked to contact Mrs. John St. Jean regarding the price she is asking for her property adjacent to the arena.

Mrs. Dorothy Rummery, Schreiber's representative to the McCausland Hospital Board, reported on current affairs of the Board - possibility of acquiring a new hospital and other aspects of Board operations.

Miss Rona Godin's application for position of assistant township clerk was accepted, with provision her salary schedule will be reviewed at the end of six months.

In informal discussions, the councillors considered the possibility of purchasing a grader for the township.
