In 1940 he came to Schreiber and went on the Road as a locomotive fireman, in which

Mr. Verdone was a member of the Bro. of L.F. and E. - Locomotive Firemen and Engineers, and associate member of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch I09, and, of the Chimo Senior Citizens' Club where when his health permitted, he enjoyed meeting former comrades on the 'Road' and a quiet game of cards - his favourite pastime.
