Under new business Council adopted the Collective Agreement of S.E.I.U. Local 268.

Under committee reports Mrs. Helmink asked about the locks for the Recreation Centre and Councillor Hale advised her they were ordered and it takes about 2 months from date of order.

Mrs. Helmink also asked council to consider tendering for the major painting required in the Curling Club. This will be done.

Her final report was the present condition of the Recreation area since the renovations. A letter will go to Barnett McQueen, contractors requesting them to return this area to its original condition.

Councillor Brassard reported the town owned house was in need of painting and this should be done after the roof is replaced.
