

BIRCHWOOD TERRACE OFFICIALLY OPENED



Mr. McClure, Federal Representative for Canada Assistance Place for Ontario had arrived earlier. Mr. D. Rafalant, Administrator of Birchwood Terrace and Mrs. Wendy Kirkpatrick, Supervisor of Services, conducted the party on a tour of the Home and its facilities. They looked in on residents' rooms newly decorated in pastel shades and gaily coloured and patterned wallpapers.

II2 students from Grades 4 to 8 have qualified for the Canada Fitness Award. This award is based on the six performance tests of The Canadian Association for Health, Physical Education and Recreation.

Crests are awarded on the basis of the level of achievement. Performance levels by age and sex have been developed. The level a participant reaches in each of the tests determines the award won.

Approximately 95% of the students competing for this award were successful.
