to John Rhodes, Minister of Transportation and Communications, was read, as a follow-up to a letter received from Reeve Roy Bray, suggesting that the M.T.C. discuss with the owners of the airstrip located at Terrace Bay, the possibility of providing proposed Nor-Ont Air Service to Terrace Bay, as is being done in other area communities.

A letter from the council of Peel, Ontario, asked endorsement of a resolution regarding hockey in the minor leagues, was discussed. This was to be brought to the attention of the Ontario Municipal Association.

A new determination has been finalized effective at the elections to be held in December regarding the distribution of Lake Superior Board of Education members. It is as follows: Schreiber Public School -1; Separate School -1; Total 2. Terrace Bay Public School -2; Separate School -1; Total -3. Manitouwadge Public School -4; Separate School -2; Total -6. Marathon Public School -3. Total Board members -14. These figures were arrived at on the basis of residential assessment.

There are two vacancies on the Recreation Committee due to the resignation of Dan Rafalant and Gerrie Dickson. These vacancies will be advertised, so that interested persons may apply.

Accounts passed for payment were: Township \$18,948.12; Hydro \$15,281.66; Library \$592.18;

Recreation Committee \$9,452.95.

Councillor Helmerk advised that summer staff has been hired for the Recreation program, the pool will open on June 21st. She stated bids are out for the painting of the lounge and prices are being requested for garbage containers at the Recreation Centre.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION SEEKING USED HEARING AIDS

An offshoot of project school-to-school and operation school supplies, which the ministry has operated through its education exchange and special projects branch for many years, project hearing aid is aimed at helping partially deaf children in the Commonwealth Caribbean countries.

The need was discovered by students of Waterloo's School of Optometry who have been working in the Caribbean for the past three summers fitting used eyeglasses for West Indian children. Just recently a Canadian living on one of the smaller islands purchased four hearing aids for deaf children and found they could hear. He is now teaching them to talk.

The used hearing aids will be repaired by one of the colleges of applied arts and technology and sent to children in the islands.
