

GRADUATES OF ADVANCED ELECTRICAL TRAINING COURSE ATTEND DINNER

Kimberly-Clark of Canada sponsored a graduation dinner for eight Electricians, who completed a two year Company sponsored Advanced Electrical Training Course; the dinner was held in the Legion Hall in Terrace Bay on May 29, 1974.
